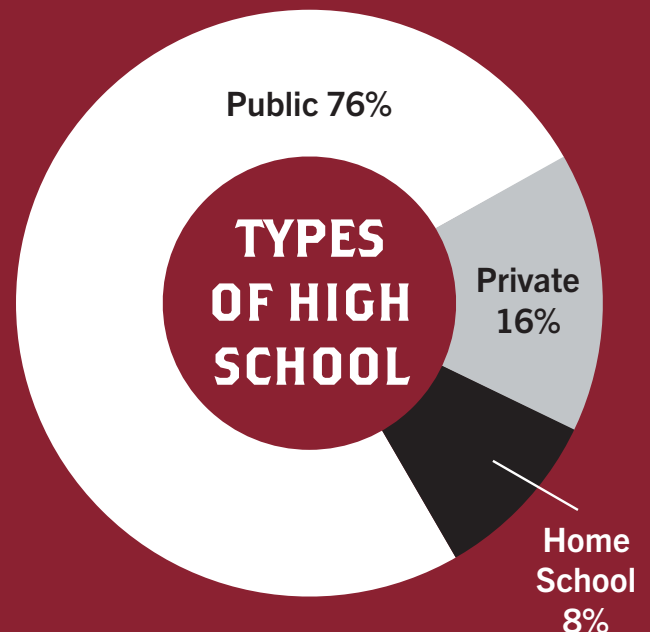
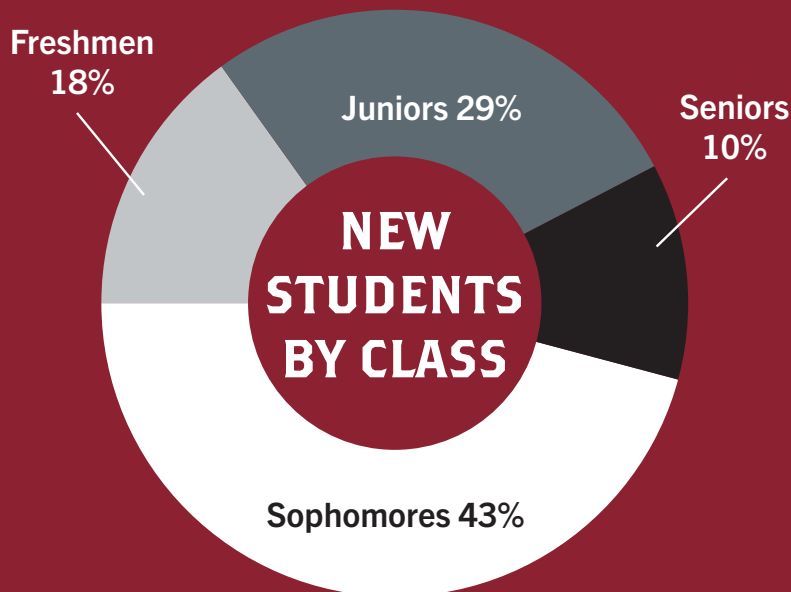

ONLINE

UA Early College provides access to a wide variety of online classes that offer the convenience and flexibility of a college education from anywhere while pursuing college credit.

- **Student Success Coaches:** full-time staff members offer academic support and assist students as academic accountability partners

- **Academic Advisors:** your guide to deciding which classes to take and when, based on your anticipated college major and high school commitments

UA EARLY COLLEGE NOW, UA GRADUATE LATER

While your UA credits can transfer to many colleges or universities, we would love for you to stay at the Capstone!

EVERY QUALIFYING EARLY COLLEGE STUDENT RECEIVES:

Priority housing as an incoming freshman when 17 or more credit hours are earned through UA Early College with a 2.5 UA GPA by December of your senior year.

Earlier registration for courses throughout your academic career at The University of Alabama.

Advanced consideration for **student athletic ticket packages** based on UA credit hours as a full-time student.

Admission to UA Honors College with 12 credit hours earned through UA Early College and a 3.5 UA GPA by December of your senior year, regardless of ACT/SAT score (pending submission of the Honors College application).

UAEC Honor Cord and acceptance into the EC Honor Society when 14 credit hours are earned through UA Early College with a 3.0 UA GPA.

Consideration for the competitive **Alumni Ivory Tusk Scholarship**, awarding \$2,000 to multiple UA Early College students in their first year as full-time UA undergraduates.





ARE YOU AN ALABAMA RESIDENT? YOUR FUTURE-READY FLAGSHIP IS PAVING THE WAY CAPSTONE EXPRESS ADMISSION TRACK

In-state students who complete 11 credit hours with UA Early College by December of their senior year with at least a 2.75 UA GPA and a 3.0 high school GPA have access to priority undergraduate admission, including a streamlined application process and no required standardized test scores. Please note that an application and transcript are still required.

UA Early College staff cannot guarantee admission into The University of Alabama. Admissions decisions are solely determined by the UA Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

FRESHMAN-YEAR TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS

- **Crimson Start Scholarship** – \$1,500 for in-state students who complete 17 credit hours by December of their senior year through UA Early College with a 3.0 UA GPA or higher
- **Capstone Start Scholarship** – \$3,000 for in-state students who complete 24 credit hours by December of their senior year through UA Early College with a 3.0 UA GPA or higher

Either scholarship is stackable with other UA scholarships up to the cost of tuition.



UAEC 200

COLLEGE READINESS COURSE

UAEC 200 prepares students for the college experience, teaching you the fundamental skills you need for academic success.

- You and your parent/guardian are required to attend a live, first class session (on campus or online) during the first week of the course.
- Students typically spend 3-4 hours per week completing this six-week online course.

UAEC 200 is a required online college readiness course offered **free** to all students. The course prepares you for a successful experience as a college student. You will earn 2 elective college credit hours, and Alabama students will receive their College and Career Readiness Indicator required for high school graduation.

This is a pass/fail course.

UAEC 200 COVERS HOW TO:

- Manage time effectively to balance academic and personal responsibilities
- Take purposeful notes that support deeper understanding
- Prepare for exams with proven study techniques
- Stay motivated and overcome procrastination

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT

Attendance at the required UAEC 200 First Class Session is mandatory. Failure to attend the UAEC 200 First Class Session constitutes withdrawal from UAEC 200 and forfeits the student's opportunity to continue in the UA Early College program through this enrollment cycle. Students who are unable to attend due to extenuating circumstances must notify the UA Early College office before the scheduled session. Exceptions, if any, will be considered at the sole discretion of the program.

UAEC 200 IMPORTANT DATES

Students gain access to their UAEC 200 course one week prior to the First Class Session date and must complete 3-4 hours of required work before that session. ***Participation in the First Class Session is mandatory for both the student and a parent/guardian.*** All times listed below are Central.

2026-2027 APPLICATION PROCESS

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for acceptance into UA Early College, students must meet the following criteria:

- Have completed the ninth grade.
- Possess a cumulative 3.0 high school GPA on a 4.0 scale.

Students may continue taking courses the summer after their senior year.

Two Steps To Apply

1. Complete the online application at earlycollege.ua.edu and pay the \$40 nonrefundable application fee.
2. Ask your school counselor to submit your high school transcript.
